



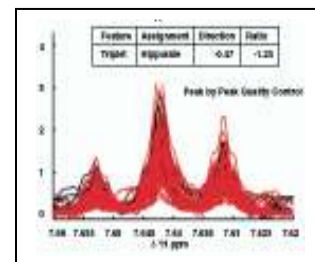
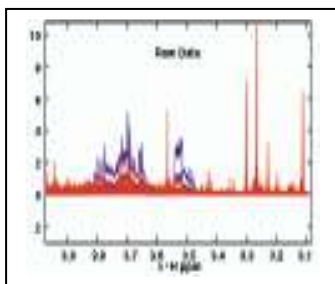
Biomarkers Technology Update Seminar
